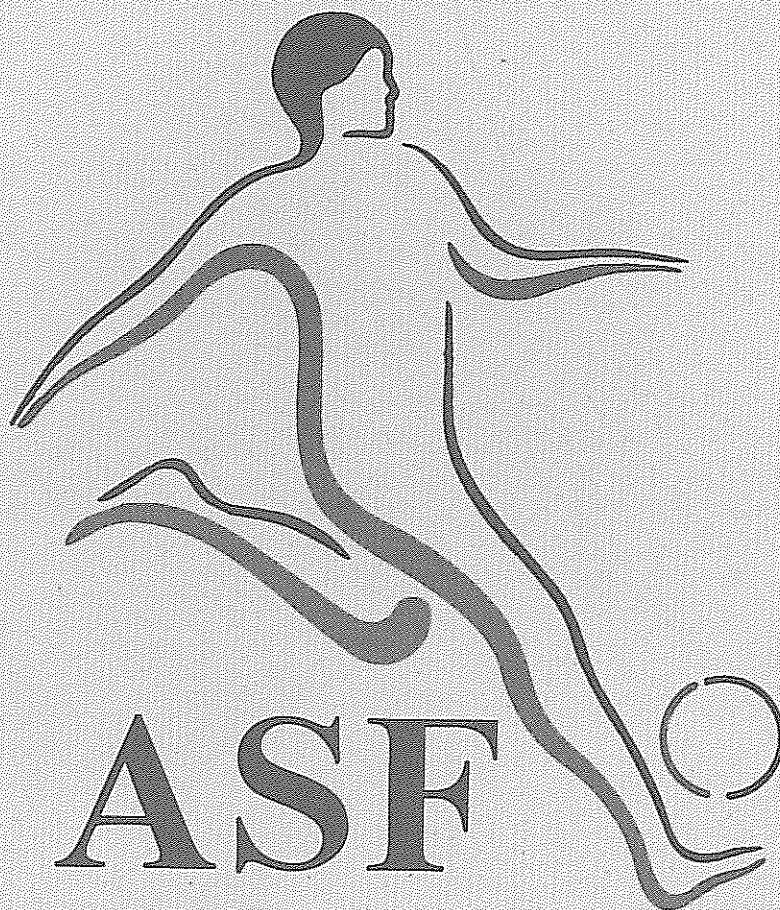

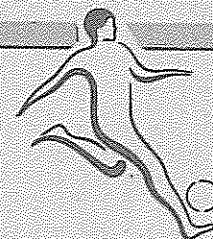

30TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice of Meeting

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the THIRTIETH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of Members of the AUSTRALIAN SOCCER FEDERATION LIMITED will be held at the RESORT HOTEL BRIGHTON BEACH, Cnr. The Grand Parade and Princess Street, Brighton-Le Sands, Sydney on SATURDAY February 15, 1992 commencing at 10.30 a.m.

Order of Business

1. Confirmation of the Minutes of the Twenty-Ninth Annual General Meeting held on February 16, 1991.
2. To receive and consider for adoption the Thirtieth Annual Report, Balance Sheet and accompanying Statements for the period ended September 30, 1991.
3. To elect Auditors for ensuing year. The retiring Auditors, Billerwell, Powers and Smith, being eligible offer themselves for re appointment at a fee to be negotiated by the Executive Committee.
4. Life Membership.
5. Special Business
To consider, and if thought fit to pass the following as a Special Resolution:
"That the Articles of Association be amended as follows:
 - (i) To insert '(a)' in front of the existing Article 78.
 - (ii) To add the following clauses to Article 78:
 - (b) The Federation as a National Association affiliated to FIFA shall comply with and enforce compliance with the FIFA Statutes, Regulations and decisions and, in particular, Articles 8, 9 and 10 of the Statutes and will cooperate with FIFA in all matters relating to the organisation of International Competitions and football in general and its own Competitions.
 - (c) In compliance with FIFA Statutes no State Federation or State Association shall be permitted to refer disputes with the Federation or any other State Federation or Association to a court of law and they must submit each one of such disputes to an Appeals Tribunal established in accordance with Article 88.
 - (d) All Members and Associate Members of the Federation other than N.S.L. Clubs shall ensure that they and all of their Member Associations and Clubs give effect to the foregoing by where necessary inserting in their Articles of Association or Governing Rules and Regulations a clause prohibiting their State Federation or

Association and their Member Associations and Clubs, Members, Players, Managers, Coaches, Referees or other Officials from taking any dispute to courts of law and requiring the parties to submit any disagreement to the jurisdiction of an Appeals Tribunal established by their State Federation or Association for decision. All parties to a decision from a State Federation or Association shall have a right of appeal to the Federation.

- (e) All N.S.L. clubs shall prior to or as soon as possible after being admitted to membership of the A.S.F. ensure that their Articles of Association are altered to prohibit the Club, its Members, Players, Managers, Coaches, or other Officials from taking any disputes to courts of law and requiring the parties to submit any disagreement either to the Federation Appeals Tribunal or the Appeals Tribunal of a State Federation or Association having jurisdiction over a competition in which the N.S.L. Club is competing.
- (f) If any dispute should arise and there is no provision for the dispute to be arbitrated by the State Federation or Association or Club concerned then such dispute will be referred by the parties to an Appeals Tribunal established in accordance with Article 88 hereof.
- (g) The decision of the Appeals Tribunal shall be final and binding on the parties to the dispute who much adhere strictly to such decision."

6. Other Business

- 6.1 That the affiliation fee for Membership of the Australian Soccer Federation Limited by set at \$1900.00 per vote effective January 1, 1992.
- 6.2 The Soccer Administration of Western Australia desire to discuss the dispute in Western Australia involving the Soccer Federation of Western Australia.
- 6.3 To transact any other business brought before the meeting by Notice of Motion.

Chairman's Report

1991 was a challenging year for Australian Soccer both on and off the pitch. The administrative structure set in place by the Bradley Report has evolved and the full time staff and the respective policy committees have begun to implement their programmes and policies.

Our national teams continued to reflect the growing status that Australia has in the world soccer community. The Socceroos established our place in soccer's hierarchy with excellent performances in the Presidents Cup in Korea and the magnificent spectacle at the Sydney Football Stadium against England.

Our Olympic team won the Oceania Qualification series and now faces a yet to be named European opponent. This team will be the fifth placed European Qualifier and will be played on a home and away basis. The Australian Olympic Committee must be acknowledged for their support of our Olympic Under 23 Team.

Our National Youth Team of course made history in Portugal with their semi final placing in the FIFA/Coca-Cola World Youth Cup (U20). Who can forget the valiant performance of our young players not only beating the European and African Champions USSR and Egypt but pushing Portugal to the limit in front of over 117,000 spectators. All these young Australians made the nation proud of Australian Soccer. They have set the platform for the Australian push to win the 1993 World Youth Cup in Australia.

Our youngest team the Joeys also performed creditably with a quarter final place in the 1991 FIFA/JVC World Youth Cup (U17) in Italy. I extend my sincere congratulations and thanks to all the players who so proudly wore the green and gold.

On the domestic front South Melbourne Hellas defeated Melbourne Croatia in front of a capacity crowd at Olympic Park. There is no doubt that the move to summer soccer has been a great success, not only in the crowd figures, but in the quality of soccer played. It is also pleasing to note that our national league is now consisting of almost all home grown players.

All our successes could not have occurred without the support of our sponsors the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, Foundation South Australia and the National Campaign Against Drug Abuse. 1992 will see our major sponsorship evolve into the Coca-Cola Sponsorship and not only are we delighted that a company with the status of Coca-Cola is being attracted to soccer, but we will be keeping close ties with the three aforementioned Health Organisations.

It would be naive not to mention the negative effective that the withdrawal of A.B.C. Television from its agreements with the Federation has had. As well as losing national soccer coverage, it has had a debilitating influence on our finances effecting the growth of the game. I must acknowledge however, both SBS Television and Harry Michaels Productions for ensuring that our National League and National Team remained on television.

It is with great sadness that I report the passing of Vic Tuting and Jim Bayutti. Both men were stalwarts of the game and made immense contributions to the development of soccer in Australia.

To all the A.S.F. Staff led by our new Chief Executive Officer Ian Holmes I record my appreciation for their efforts in difficult times. Also I must thank my Board of Commissioners for their continuing support. The year of challenge is now over, I look forward to 1992 a year of consolidation and growth.

Chief Executive Officer's Report

It's with great pleasure I write my inaugural report as Chief Executive Officer for the Australian Soccer Federation. Due to the implementation of the Bradley Report the A.S.F. has undertaken a rapid growth and with this, the administrative challenges associated with expansion.

It must be immediately acknowledged that the Australian Sports Commission has played an integral part in our growth. They have not only financed many of our new management positions but have given us policy direction. With their support we are continuing to strive to achieve the philosophical goals, outlined in our development plan.

The success of our national teams has been well documented by our Chairman, however, it must be noted that these national teams belong to all our soccer community. The A.S.F. development fee, paid by every player, coach and referee ensures that we give our players the level of preparation so vital to elite competition.

The elite competition of world soccer is of course administered by the Federation of International Football Associations (F.I.F.A.). Australia is an active member of this world body and has been recognised so, by being granted the honour of hosting the 1993 FIFA Coca-Cola World Youth Cup (U20) finals. Our preparation for this mammoth task has already begun with our appointment of a Project Manager to ensure that we match our players with the quality of our off field administration.

Australian Soccer is advancing into the 1990's and to symbolise this advancement we have implemented a marketing programme to ensure that we take the game to as many people as possible. Our new dynamic logo, linked in with licensed promotional equipment and merchandise has ensured that we will take Australian Soccer to a new wider audience. Of course our welcome relationship with Coca-Cola has enabled us to achieve the higher market profile we seek.

Our National Coaching Scheme continues to educate and train people to develop our players at all levels.

A complete review of our Scheme is being undertaken so as to meet not only the Australian Coaching Council's requirements and standards, but just as importantly our future needs.

As part of the review our Director of Coaching attended a FIFA Course in Brazil.

The ASF is very conscious of the need for forward planning and has approved the introduction of a National Licence Scheme for coaches in 1993, also the implementation of minimum Accreditation Levels in 1995.

We also do not take for granted our large junior participation base, we have implemented through our development programme, the game of RooBall, which spreads our philosophies of maximum participation, equity, skill acquisition and fun. Also we have developed a "hero" program, where our Coca-Cola Soccer League's newly appointment Development Officers take our leading players into the schools.

It must be remembered however that Australian Soccer is a Federation, a body made of state holders and affiliates who implement at grass roots level our national policy initiatives. I would like to thank these members for their continued support of the Federation and the often unsung work being carried out at the state and junior level.

The past year has indeed been one of challenge for Australian soccer, it is essential that in 1992 we adopt a united front to ensure that we consolidate the hard work undertaken in 1991 and that we continue to grow and help take soccer to its true place at the top of the Australian Sporting Community.

National Teams

Australian Socceroos

The programme for the Quit Socceroos took place during the period of January to June 1991.

It provided for a two match series against Czechoslovakia, a two match series against New Zealand in the Southern Cross Cup played on a home and away basis, the exciting clash against England played at the Sydney Football Stadium, and finally participation in the prestigious President's Cup in Korea.

This programme allowed National Coach, Eddie Thomson the opportunity of testing his players against formidable opposition in the start of his campaign for qualification for the 1994 World Cup in the United States of America.

Our path to the 1994 World Cup Finals will require Australia to not only defeat Nations which are part of the Oceania Confederation but also to play against teams from Concacaf and the Conembol Confederations.

The new year will see the Socceroos line up against the Sweden National Team who will visit our shores for a three match series in Sydney, Adelaide and Melbourne in January/February 1992.

Australian Olympic Team

At the time of compiling this report the Australian Olympic Team had successfully won the Oceania Preliminary Competition series for the Olympic Games.

The Australian Soccer Federation owes a deep debt of gratitude to the Australian Olympic Committee for the level of financial support which they contribute towards the team. Without this support it would be difficult to maintain an Olympic Team.

The last hurdle to qualify for the 1992 Olympic Games in Barcelona will be matches against an as yet unknown European Nation. The final leg of qualifying is expected to take place in April 1992.

The Australian Soccer Federation has requested the matches against the European Team take place on a Home and Away basis rather than a single match in a neutral country. We are awaiting FIFA's decision.

Talent Identification Series

The 1991 Series were organised for the first time by the Australian Soccer Federation.

During the year the Australian Soccer Federation Planning and Policy Committee for Development established an interim Talent Identification Junior Consultative Committee to look at the future conduct and rationalisation of the whole series.

The Talent Identification Program provides the vital base for the initial selection procedures of our National Junior and Youth sides.

Australian Youth Under 20 Team

The Australian Youth Under 20 Team made soccer history in Portugal in 1991, when they reached the semi final of the FIFA/Coca-Cola World Youth Cup semi final. Although beaten 1-0 by eventual winners Portugal in a tremendous match in front of 117,000 people, the players were a credit to both themselves and their country. To reach this stage the young Australians had to beat both the European Champions Russia and the African champions Egypt. The players truly proved that at this age grouping Australia is on a par with the rest of the elite soccer nations. The following players proudly wore the green and gold: M Bosnich, R Spasevski, R Stojceviski, M Babic, P Okon, A Poric, M Bingley, I Kindtner, D Seal, K Trajanovski, S Corica, K Muscat, T Popovic, B Maloney, R Stanton, M Silic, G Sorras, Z Kalac.

Australian Youth Under 17 Team

The Australian Youth Under 17 Team reached the quarter final of the FIFA/JVC World Youth U17 Cup held in the soccer mad country of Italy. Despite losing to Qatar, victorious over Mexico and the Congo gained a place in the quarter finals, where we were narrowly beaten 2-1 by Argentina. Prominent in this array of young talent were P Dec, A Carbone, V Kalegoracos, P Agostino, A Kiratzoglou and B Moore.

It is hoped that a number of these young players follow the path of Paul Trimboli and eventually become Socceroos. This level of competition at a world level makes our players extremely competitive.

Notes to and Forming Part of the Accounts for the year ended 30th September 1991

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Statements of Accounting Concepts and disclosure requirements of the Australian accounting bodies, applicable Accounting Standards, the provisions of Schedule 5 to the Corporations Regulations and the requirements of law. They have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and do not take into account changing money values nor, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. Except where stated, the accounting policies have been consistently applied.

Set out below is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the company in the preparation of the accounts.

DEPRECIATION OF FIXED ASSETS

Depreciation has been charged on fixed assets at rates assessed to match the cost of each of the assets over their economic life.

INVENTORIES

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are determined on a first in first out basis.

INCOME TAX

No provision has been made for income tax as the company is exempt in accordance with the terms of Section 23(g)(iii) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936, as amended.

EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

The amounts expected to be paid to employees for their pro-rata entitlement to long service, annual and sick leave are accrued annually at current pay rates having regard to experience of employees' departures and period of service.

LEASED NON-CURRENT ASSETS

A distinction is made between finance leases which effectively transfer from the lessor to the lessee substantially all the risks and benefits incident to ownership of non-current assets and operating leases under which the lessor effectively retains all such risks and benefits. Where non-current assets are acquired by means of finance leases, the present value of minimum lease payments is established as an asset at the beginning of the lease term and amortised on a straight line basis over its expected economic life. A corresponding liability is also established and each lease payment is allocated between such liability and interest expense. Operating lease payments are charged to expense in the periods in which they are incurred.

COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE

Every member of the company undertakes in accordance with the Memorandum of Association of the company to contribute such amount (not exceeding \$20.00) as may be required in the event of the winding up of the company during the time that they are a member or within one year afterwards.

ACCOUNTS DISCLOSURE

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Schedule 5 of the Corporations Regulations and comply with Statements of Accounting Concepts and applicable accounting standards.
